SUBJECT: Movie Review – *The Twilight Saga: Breaking Dawn Part 1* – December 2011

Note: The following movie review of **The Twilight Saga: Breaking Dawn Part 1** contains plot detail spoilers.

In this latest installment of the *Twilight* saga teen Bella Swan (Kristen Stewart) and her vampire heartthrob boyfriend Edward Cullen (Robert Pattinson) finally get married in a grand ceremony, much to the dismay of her wolf friend Jacob (Taylor Lautner) and the befuddlement of her father Charlie (Billy Burke). Following a long honeymoon at a secluded beach house in scenes reminiscent of *The Blue Lagoon*, Bella finds herself pregnant with a baby that could threaten her life and also the delicate truce between the vampire and wolf clans. As the birth of the baby gets closer lots of heavy drama ensues...

^{*} In my review of the first installment of the *Twilight* saga I praised the movie for having good acting, interesting characters and a compelling Romeo & Juliet-style love story. Having now seen all four films I can say that none of that has changed, and also that I personally liked *Twilight* and *Eclipse* a bit better than parts two and four in the series mainly because the first and third installments had more action in them. I could comment on many specific plot elements in *Breaking Dawn Part 1*, but suffice it to say that, generally speaking, fans of this series (as well as fans of teen soap operas) will probably like this film as much as any of the preceding ones. And people who didn't like *Twilight* from the beginning – notably many horror fans - will only have that view reinforced by watching the latest installment. This is primarily because the series is mostly about drama, romance and love (as opposed to horror, blood and gore) amongst young people who just happen to also be vampires and wolves. Being the tried and true horror fan that I am, I'll simply say that I will probably always prefer cinematic creatures of the feral, vicious nature to cultured, outspoken ones. However that having been said, there is also nothing wrong with a good love story as well every now and then.
